GENERAL ADMISSION RULES FOR SELF-FINANCED COURSES

- **Rules Regarding Seats, Eligibility Conditions and Basis of Admission**

Seats

The total numbers of seats in BBA course are 60, distributes as under:

Category	Seats
Subsidized	40
Non-Subsidized	20
Total Seats	60

Eligibility Criteria

Plus two examination under 10+2 system or examination equivalent thereof to a Board/University established by law in India with 45% marks (40% marks in case of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe)

Or

Any examination of University / Board / College or School in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for the above purpose by the Vice Chancellor / Equivalence Committee of its own or on recommendation of Association of Indian Universities AIU House, 16 Kalka Marg, New Delhi 110 002 with 45% marks. (40% marks in case of Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe).

Basis of Admission

SCHEME-I

(Subsidised Seats)

There shall be **no entrance examination** for candidates seeking admission to BBA/BCA course. The selection process will be on merit-basis of marks obtained by candidate in 12th Board Examination.

SCHEME-II

(Non-subsidised Seats)

After filling seats in subsidized category, top 20 candidates in the merit list will be admitted to the programme. The candidate seeking admission under payment non-subsidised category must submit his /her consent.

Age Limit

Except for NRI/NRI sponsored candidates and foreign candidates, the maximum age limit for admission to BBA/BCA programme is 22 years as on **first of July** of the year concerned, provided that in case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribes, the upper age limit will be **relaxed by three years**. However, the Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation of maximum period of three months for reason to be recorded in writing.

Dress Code

A formal dress implies cultivation of special attitude and also adds to personality development.

Dress Code for BBA

- 1) Sky Blue Shirt with Formal Black Trousers, Maroon Tie, and Formal Black Leather Shoes with Laces for Boys and Black Leather Shoes with Strip/ Black formal Bellies for Girls, Black Socks and Black Leather Belt.
- 2) Steel Grey Sweater and Steel Grey Blazer Coat Shall be the dress code during the winters or both, Boys and Girls during winter season.
- 3) Boys are advised to be clean shaved (not applicable on Sikh students) and Girls should keep their hairs in proper order.

Dress Code for BCA

- 1) White Plain Shirt and Black Formal Trousers, Black Tie, Formal Black Leather Shoes with Laces for Boys and Black Leather Shoes with Strip/ Black formal Bellies for Girls, Black Socks and Black Leather Belt.
- 2) Black Sweater and Navy Blue Blazer Coat shall be the dress Code during the winters for both Boys and Girls during winter season.
- 3) Boys are advised to be clean shaved (not applicable on Sikh students) and Girls should keep their hairs in proper order.

Note: Dress code is compulsory and strictly to be followed by the students. Violators will be fined Rs.100 per day.

Reservation

Admission to the course except for seats reserved for NRI's /NRI sponsored and foreign students shall be subject to the following conditions:

- a) 15% and 7.5% seats shall be reserved for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates respectively, who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education, or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh affiliated to any other Education Board e.g. CBSE or ICSE Board etc. However, reservation of seats will be governed by notification of the Government from time to time.
 - b) The remaining 77.5% seats shall be filled as under:-
 - i. 25% of the seats for admission to the course shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from which they have passed their qualifying examination.
 - ii. 75% of the seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or any other school located within territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh affiliated to any other Education Board e.g. CBSE or ICSE Board etc. subject to the following reservation.
 - a) 5% of all seats shall be reserved for outstanding sportsmen.
 - b) 5% of the seats shall be reserved for the outstanding cultural activists.
 - c) 3% of the seats shall be reserved for physically handicapped candidates.
- Provided that the minimum eligibility for admission to the course in case of SC/ST will be 5% lower than the eligibility conditions for other candidates

Note: 120 point's roster of H.P. University showing reservations of various categories for admissions shall be followed.



CODE OF CONDUCT AND GENERAL RULE

1. The Decision of Principal in all matters will be final and binding.
2. Students must be seated in the classrooms before the start of the lecture. No student shall enter the class or knock the door after 5(five) minutes of start of the class.
3. No student shall be loitering near the classes once the classes are in progress.
4. Regular attendance in the class including guest lecturers is compulsory.
5. Use of Mobile Phone is strictly prohibited in the college premises. A student using mobile phone in classroom/lab will be fined Rs.500/- and no exemption will be given in any case.
6. Every student will submit assignments; project etc. as per periodic directions.
7. Misbehavior, Persistence disobedience, habitual late coming, consumption of drug or liquor in the institute, cheating in the examination and any unbecoming act may invite strict disciplinary action including expulsion from the institute.
8. Each student is expected to observe the college dress code strictly.
9. Each student is expected to be present regularly in the college. Name will be struck-off if a candidate absentees himself continuously for six days. Candidates can get re-admission after satisfying the Principal.
10. No student is permitted to undertake any part time/whole time job during the course of study.
11. No student is allowed to put posters in college campus or notice board and to hold assembly in college premises or to address on unauthorized assembly in the college campus.
12. Any student making loss to the college property will be penalized and the students concerned will have to replace or get the same repaired at his/her own cost.
13. Food, breweries and any type of drink are not permitted in the lab/classrooms.
14. Students are not allowed to leave the college campus during teaching hours without prior permission.
15. Parents will be intimated about the progress of their ward periodically through report card and personal feedback.
16. Every student must always carry with him/her duly completed identity card.

Curbing Ragging in the Institute

Ragging in institute is strictly banned according to the judgment and directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Himachal Pradesh University and guidelines issued by UGC in this regards. The following guidelines will be observed to prevent incidents of ragging in the institute.

1. Every candidate seeking admission will give undertaking duly printed on the application form that he / she will not indulge in ragging and if found guilty he / she will be liable for punishment. Similar undertaking will be obtained from the parents / guardians of applicant.
2. Anti Ragging committee has been constituted in the college.
3. Whenever a ragging incident is brought to the notice of college authorities, the disciplinary committee will hold an enquiry into the incident.
4. If any student is found guilty of ragging after the enquiry then he / she will be punishable accordingly. The punishment may include :-
 - i) Expulsion from the College
 - ii) Suspension from the classes
 - iii) Fine with a public apology
 - iv) Withholding scholarship or other benefits
 - v) Debarring from the representation in events
 - vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess
 - vii) Legal proceeding under criminal law shall be initiated
5. If any student is found guilty of ragging incident occurred in the past then he/she may be expelled from the institution.

Leave Rules

a) General Leave Rules

- i) Student can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, they should fill in the leave forms to be supplied to the students (@ Rs. 5/- per booklet).
- ii) A maximum of 5 days leave is allowed in a semester. A tutor can recommend leave upto 3 days; for longer duration i.e. up to 5 days, a student must get the application signed by the Coordinator of the programme.
- iii) Leave during House Examination / Class Tests should be avoided, if unavoidable will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the Coordinator.
- iv) Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

(b) Duty Leave Rules

Participation by the students in sports/ cultural / NSS / NCC / Co-curricular activities, Inter College / University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition. Duty Leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity in charge.

Attendance (Lecture, Guest Lecture, Seminars & Practical's)

The students are required to be punctual and regular in their classes. According to the University rules every student must attend 75% lectures both in theory and practical separately. The Principal can condone the participated days in every course including practical in respect of students who have to miss classes on account of their participation in NCC/ NSS/ Sports Cultural / Academic / Co-Curricular activities.

Rules for Computer Lab

- 1) Lab computers are for academic and research use. Personal e-mailing, chatting and games are not permitted.
- 2) Setting of the computers should not be changed.
- 3) No personal CDs, Pen Drives and Memory Cards are allowed in computer lab.
- 4) Internet facility can be availed with the prior permission of a teacher.
- 5) Accessing prohibited sites may invite penalty or suspension from Lab/ College.

Re-Admission

- In case the name of a student is struck off, the re-admission is permissible within 1st seven days with first re-admission fee of Rs.100/-on a prescribed Performa. If the student fails to seek re-admission within first seven days then he/she should seek re-admission within 12days, on payment of Rs.200 as second re-admission fee on the personal presence of parent/guardian. After 12 days from the date of his/her name is struck off, there shall be no re-admission in any condition.
- If the name of the student is struck off again then 2nd re-admission fee is Rs.200/- and if the name of the student is struck off 3rd time, there is no provision for re-admission in that case.

Eligibility for Promotion

A candidate should have passed at least 50% papers of 1st year i.e.1st and 2nd Semester to get admission to 3rd Semester of 2nd year and passing 50% papers of 1st and 2nd year shall determine the eligibility for admission to 5th semester of 3rd year(the amendment is applicable w.e.f. academic session1996-97).The pass marks in each subject shall be 40% while appearing in the examination within two available chances. The candidates placed in compartment may be exempted from appearing in paper(s) in which he/she has already obtained required pass marks.The aggregate marks obtained by the candidate examination shall be the sum total of the marks obtained by him/her in which he/she has passed.

The successful candidates shall be classified in three Divisions as under:-

- First Division: 60% or more of the aggregate marks.
- Second Division: 50% or more but less than 60% of the aggregate marks.
- Third Division: less than 50% of the aggregate marks.

A candidate obtaining pass marks in any course shall not be required to re-appear in that course again. However, **the candidate shall be required to complete his/her B.B.A. degree within a maximum period of five years.**

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

- The pass percentage in each subject will be 40%.
- **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA):** 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
- **End-Semester Examination (ESE)** accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

Note:

A student will have to pass both the components (i.e. CCA and ESE) separately to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.

Theory Papers:

- (i) Each paper will be of 100 marks (70 marks for End Semester Examination and 30 marks for Continuous Comprehensive Assessment) and duration of each paper will be 3 hours.
- (ii) In each theory paper, nine questions are to be set. Two questions are to be set from each Unit and candidate is required to attempt at least one question from each unit. Question number nine will be compulsory, which will be of short answer type with 5 to 10 parts, out of the entire syllabus. In all, five questions are to be attempted.

Mid-Term (Minor) Test

There will be one mid-term test, to be conducted when approximately 2/3 of the syllabus has been covered. This mid-term test will be for 15 marks. Mid-term test will be conducted by the college in consultation with the teacher.

Seminar/Assignment/Term Paper

The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment/term paper etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.

End-Semester Examination (ESE)

The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an end semester examination (ESE) that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Note:

1. Only those students will be allowed to appear in the ESE who have been successful in the CCA.
2. A student, who fulfills all the requirements for appearing in a semester examination, is unable to appear in the examination or to complete it on account of his/her own serious illness, accident, or on account of the death of near relative (mother, father, brother and sister), or the dates of state or national level examinations falls on dates of the semester exams may be allowed to appear in the semester exam in the next academic year when examination for that semester is due.
3. Permission to sit in the examination will be permitted by college Principal/Director on the production of a valid certificate/document from the competent authority. The college will send the name of the student to the Registration and Migration Cell for information.

Practical Examination (Max. Marks: 50)

CCA (Continuous Comprehensive Assessment): 35

ESE (End Semester Examination): 15

Duration: 3 hours.

Practical exam will be conducted by the external examiner from the panel submitted to The Chairman, Computer Science Department, Himachal Pradesh University and duly approved by the competent authority of the university, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.

Project Work (Max. Marks: 50)

CCA (Continuous Comprehensive Assessment): 35

ESE (End Semester Examination): 15

In the 6th semester the student has to develop one project, which will be evaluated by the external examiner from the panel submitted to The Chairman, Computer Science Department, Himachal Pradesh University, and duly approved by the university

authority/evaluation branch, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla on the following basis:

1. Project Report 10 Marks (To be evaluated externally)
2. Seminar 15 Marks (To be evaluated internally)
3. Viva Voce 25 Marks (To be evaluated externally)

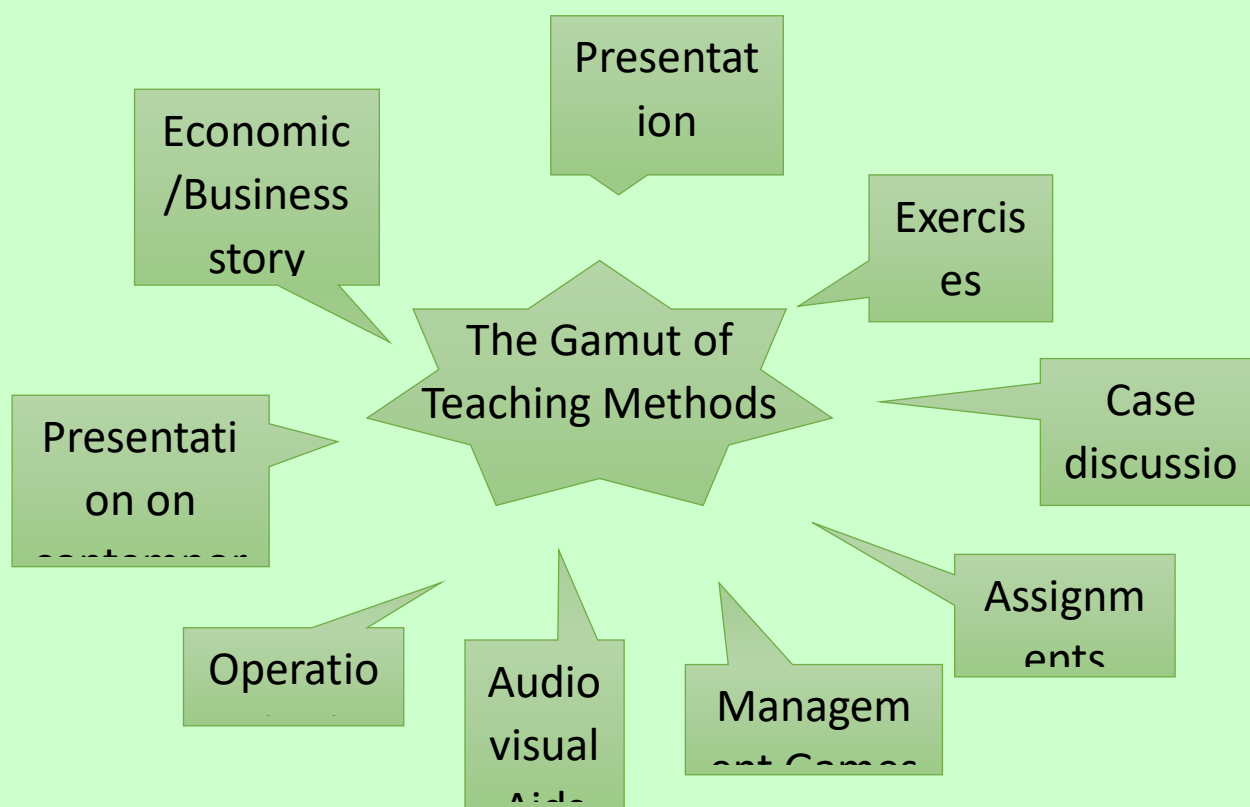
