

Admission Procedure in BBA Courses:

The final admission to 60 subsidized seats is based on competitive examination which comprises weightage of percentage in 10+2 examination and entrance test. The weightage assigned in computing merit is as follows:

<u>1. Weightage of Percentage in 10+2 Examination:</u> 20 Marks for 10+2 examination levels on the basis of percentage scored in the examination.

(Candidates having commerce subject at 10+2 level will be given 10 extra marks while calculating the merit.)

2. BBA Entrance Test: 70 Marks

Composition of BBA Entrance Test:

The BBA Entrance Test will comprise of four parts:

a. General English : (20 marks)
b. General Mathematics : (20 marks)
c. General Management : (20 marks)
d. General Knowledge : (10 marks)

Admission Procedure in BCA Courses:

The final admission to 60 subsidized seats is based on competitive examination which comprises weightage of percentage in 10+2 examination and Entrance Test. The weightage assigned in computing merit is as follows:

1. Weightage of Percentage in 10+2 Examination: 20 Marks for 10+2 examination levels on the basis of percentage scored in the examination.

(Candidates having mathematics subject at 10+2 level will be given 10 extra marks while calculating the merit.)

2. BCA Entrance Test: 70 Marks

Composition of BCA Entrance Test:

The BCA Entrance Test will comprise of four parts:

a. General English : (20 marks)
b. General Mathematics : (20 marks)
c. General Computer Knowledge : (20 marks)
d. General Knowledge. : (10 marks)

Note:

- **1.** No re-evaluation or rechecking of marks is allowed for written test.
- **2.** The roster of admission (120-point roster), showing reservations of various categories shall be used as per H.P. University rules.

- 2. A student, who fulfills all the requirements for appearing in a semester examination, is unable to appear in the examination or to complete it on account of his/her own serious illness, accident, or on account of the death of near relative (mother, father, brother and sister), or the dates of state or national level examinations falls on dates of the semester exams may be allowed to appear in the semester exam in the next academic year when examination for that semester is due.
- 3. Permission to sit in the examination will be permitted by college Principal/Director on the production of a valid certificate/document from the competent authority. The college will send the name of the student to the Registration and Migration Cell for information.

General Rules for Leave/Fee /Fine

Leave Rules

General Leave Rules

- i) Student can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, they should fill in the leave forms to be supplied to the students Rs. 5. A maximum of 5 days leave is allowed in a semester. A tutor can recommend leave up to 3 days; for longer duration i.e. up to 5 days, a student must get the application signed by the Coordinator of the programme.
- ii) Leave during House Examination / Class Tests should be avoided, if unavoidable will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the Coordinator.
- iii) Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.
- iv) If a student remains absent from classes regularly from five days, his/her name will be struck-off from roll call.
- v) Even if there is any irregularity to attend the classes, then also name will be struck- off from roll call.

FEES/FUNDS/FINE RULES

- 1. a) Every student must pay his/her dues on the dates notified from time to time. A student will have to pay the First Installment of dues at the time of admission for 1st semester and for the rest of the semesters, the fee should be paid before the beginning of the respective semester.
- a) Failure to pay dues on the due date will entail a fine of Re. 1/-per day.
- b) In case of non-payment of dues, the name of the student will be struck off from the rolls at the end of that month.
- c) Registration fee will not be charged to student migrating from another college if he is already registered with H.P. University. Other dues will have to be paid from the month of joining this institution provided the student has not paid the dues in the college from which he has migrated.

Re-Admission

- 1. In case the name of a student is struck off, the re-admission is permissible within 1st seven days with first re-admission fee of Rs.200/-on a prescribed Performa. If the student fails to seek re-admission within first seven days then he/she should seek re-admission within 12 days, on payment of Rs.500/- as second re-admission fee on the personal presence of parent/guardian. After 12 days from the date of his/her name is struck off, there shall be no re-admission in any condition.
- 2. If the name of the student is struck off again then 2^{nd} re-admission fee is Rs.500/- and if the name of the student is struck off 3^{rd} time, there is no provision for re-admission in that case.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. The Decision of Principal in all matters will be final and binding.
- 2. Students must be seated in the classrooms before the start of the lecture. No student shall enter the class or knock the door after 5(five) minutes of start of the class.
- 3. No student shall be loitering near the classes once the classes are in progress.
- Regular attendance in the class including guest lecturers is compulsory.
- 5. Use of Mobile Phone is strictly prohibited in the college premises. A student using mobile phone in classroom/lab will be fined Rs.500/- and no exemption will be given in any case.
- 6. Every student will submit assignments; project etc. as per periodic directions.
- 7. Misbehavior, Persistence disobedience, habitual late coming, consumption of drug or liquor in the institute, cheating in the examination and any unbecoming act may invite strict disciplinary action including expulsion from the institute.
- 8. Each student is expected to observe the college dress code strictly.

- 9. Each student is expected to be present regularly in the college. Name will be struck-off if a candidate absentees himself continuously for six days. Candidates can get re-admission after satisfying the Principal.
- 10. No student is permitted to undertake any part time/whole time job during the course of study.
- 11. No student is allowed to put posters in college campus or notice board and to hold assembly in college premises or to address on unauthorized assembly in the college campus.
- 12. Any student making loss to the college property will be penalized and the students concerned will have to replace or get the same repaired at his/her own cost.
- 13. Food, breweries and any type of drink are not permitted in the lab/classrooms.
- 14. Students are not allowed to leave the college campus during teaching hours without prior permission.
- 15. Parents will be intimated about the progress of their ward periodically through report card and personal feedback.
- Every student must always carry with him/her duly completed identity card.

Ragging and Anti-Social Activities

Ragging in institute is strictly banned according to the judgment and directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Himachal Pradesh University and guidelines issued by UGC in this regards. The following guidelines will be observed to prevent incidents of ragging in the institute.

- 1. Every candidate seeking admission will give an undertaking duly printed on the application form that he/she will not indulge in ragging and if found guilty he / she will be liable for punishment. A similar undertaking will be obtained from the parents / guardians of applicant.(Fill Annexure-I and II)
- 2. Anti-Ragging committee has been constituted in the college.
- 3. Whenever a ragging incident is brought to the notice of college authorities, the disciplinary committee will hold an enquiry into the incident.
- 4. If any student is found guilty of ragging after the enquiry then he / she will be punishable accordingly. The punishment may include:
 - i) Expulsion from the College
 - ii) Suspension from the classes
 - iii) Fine with a public apology
 - iv) With holding scholarship or other benefits
 - v) Debarring from the representation in events
 - vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess
 - vii) Legal proceeding under criminal law shall be initiated
- 5. If any student is found guilty of ragging incident occurred in the past then he/she may be expelled from the institution.

This College is committed to a zero tolerance policy towards:

1. Ragging:

Ragging is a punishable offence. Ragging of all kind is strictly banned in the college campus. Anybody caught indulging in this evil exercise shall face penalty under the law. Act remotely suggestive of ragging should be reported to the college authorities/to the member of anti-ragging committee. A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term, which may extend to three years or shall or both.

- 2. Crime against Women.
- 3. Consumption of Alcohol in the college premises.
- 4. Misconduct, Hooliganism in college premises.
- 5. Possession or use of firearms
- 6. Possession or use of hallucinogenic

In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/indiscipline if the past or if is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission shall be refused to him/her or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith For Himachal Pradesh University Act, statutes and ordinances as amended till date log in to University website www.hpuniv.nic.in Ordinance Vol. I, II, III) Further, In pursuance to the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08-05-2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009 the UGC had notified "Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions,2009".
